Story Map must include the following: (Remember to add illustrations to each section)

- Title of story
- Author
- Characters (Major and Minor Characters...give names, descriptions, traits, feelings)
- Setting (when and where... be descriptive)
- Problem/Conflict (the main dilemma that led the characters to act the way they did)
- Plot (major sequence of events in order)
 - Beginning
 - Middle
 - Ending
- Solution/Resolution (how the problem got solved or resolved)
- Theme/Author's Message (What can you learn from the story? How should the characters avoid the problem in the future?)

Students will be expected to take the Accelerated Reader Exam within the <u>first two</u> weeks of school.
